- C Left side, the opposite direction from cars

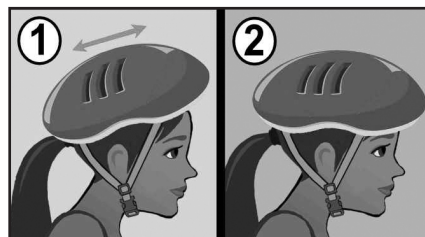
3. When riding a bike in the street, when should you look for cars behind you?

5. A helmet can protect your brain if you fall while biking. Which picture shows the correct way to wear a helmet?

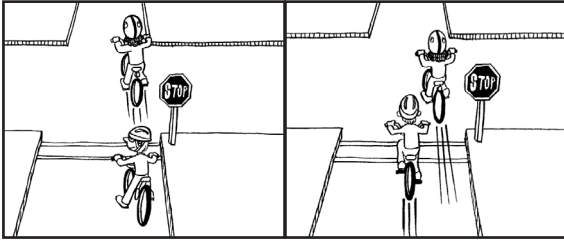


- A 1: Tilted on your head

6. When can you begin riding your bike in the street?

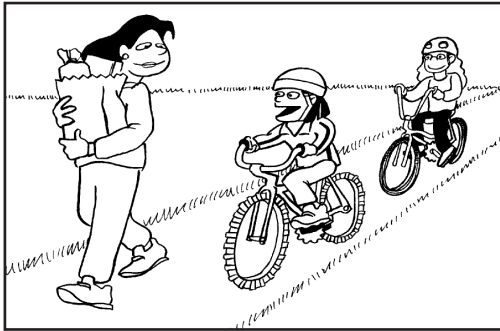
- A At age 10

7. A friend is biking ahead of you. They look for cars before crossing a street. Do you need to look for cars too?



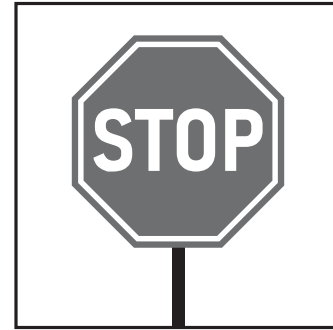
- A Yes
